

## LLV Lights and Scoreboards

A few instructions on the lights and scoreboards at LLV.

Basics: "Zone 1" is the upper field, "Zone 2" is the lower field

Setting up scoreboard:

- 1) Controller and extension cord will be in the field equipment box that must be locked following all games and practices.
- 2) On the upper field there is an extension cord already in place. On the lower field, there is a plug at the base of the 1st base light pole. The controllers need power, but operate the scoreboard remotely - wireless.
- 3) To turn on the scoreboards, the main power is in a control box down behind the 1st base line on the lower field. Turn on the appropriate scoreboard and the scoreboard should light right up. If not, then there is a problem - please let me know about it.
- 4) Once the scoreboard is on, it is operated from the controller. Basic instructions are on the inside of the controller. Identify someone who is going to pay attention the whole time as - we don't need the umpire questioning the balls/strikes all the time.
- 5) Once game is complete, pack up controller and extension cord and put away in the appropriate equipment box. Again, please make sure box is locked before leaving the field.
- 6) Turn off scoreboard power source at the main power control box.

Lights:

- 1) County controls and programs the lights. A schedule of all our games has been provided to them so all we have to do is turn them on and off at the appropriate times. Hence, if there are game changes, the league scheduler needs to know about them.
- 2) Lights cannot be turned on until the latest of these two times: one hour prior to sunset time or 1/2 hour prior to the start of the game.
- 3) Once the time frame has been reached, head over to the control box down behind the 1st base line on the lower field. This is the same box where the scoreboard controls are. Press the appropriate zone "ON" button. Lights should come right on. If they don't, one of two things: 1) The time noted above has not been reached; 2) The lights are not programmed.
- 4) If the lights do not come on in a few minutes - give it about 10 minutes - call Ed Richardson from the county as he can get the lights programmed to come on. (Call Bob Woodruff for his numbers as I am not publishing them.) Please make sure you have waited the appropriate time before calling.
- 5) Once game is complete and nearly everyone is gone, you can then shut the lights off from the control box by pressing the "OFF" button for the appropriate zone. One light pole will remain on for 10-15 minutes to provide some light for the last few folks.
